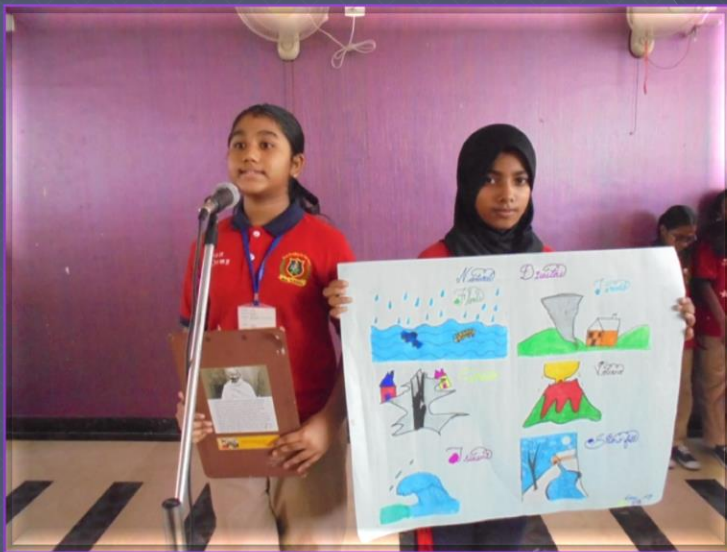
INTERNATIONAL DAY OF GIRL CHILD – 11.10.2019

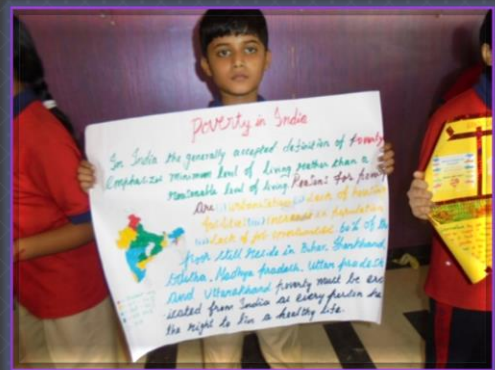
INTERNATIONAL DAY FOR RURAL WOMEN – 18.10.2019

SWF SCIENCE WORKSHOP 2019 – 17.10.2019 TO 19.10.2019

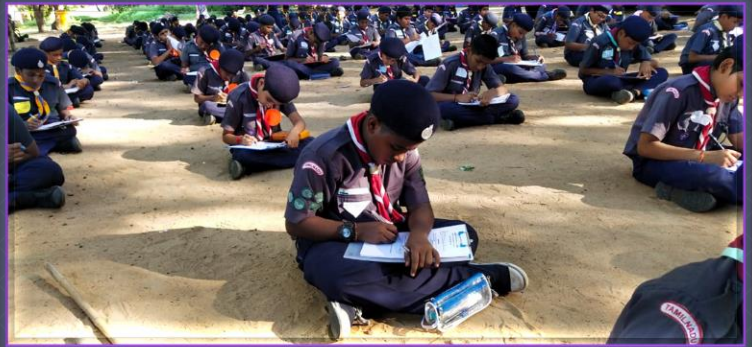
