































WORLD DAY AGAINST CHILD LABOUR

The International Labour Organization (ILO) started observing World Day Against Child Labour in 2002 with an aim to highlight the plight of children who are the victims of child labour. The day serves as a catalyst to take forward the global movement against the practice. Social protection is both a human right and a potent policy tool to prevent families from resorting to child labour in times of crisis. However, as of 2020 and before the COVID-19 crisis took hold, only 46.9 per cent of the global population were effectively covered by at least one social protection benefit. Coverage for children is even lower. Nearly three quarters of children, 1.5 billion, lacked social protection.








WORLD ASTEROID DAY









For Physical, Mental, intellectual development of students, Students were given a day off from studies without carrying a bag and engaged them in various creative activities. On this day few activities were planned


- Musical chairs



- They had a great time and departed the location with joy.













