


















"ECSTASY"

About 10 schools and 150 students from reputed CBSE Schools participated and took back trophies and certificatesEven though the competitions were commerce based, the occasion was a platform to celebrate the spirit of competition not only among the students of 11th and 12th grade students of commerce discipline but also the students from 9th an 10th grade, to give an exposure to the commerce stream. The General guidelines and Gist of the agenda was circulated amongst the schools in advance and they were given an option to register through the Google Form. The school had a festive look welcoming the students and letting others know about the ongoing event. The classrooms were arranged and decorated according to the event that was to take place. 










NO BAG DAY CLASS 1 TO 5




For Physical, Mental, intellectual development of students, they were given a day off from studies without carrying a bag and engaged them in various creative activities. On this day few activites were planned










NO BAG DAY CLASS 6 TO 8

First Aid Awareness-








TRAFFIC AND ROAD SAFETY RULES

Road safety rules in India are designed in the best interest of vehicle owners. You may follow the below-mentioned ten rules and regulations while driving to reduce the risk of accidents and ensure safe driving.

Always wear a seatbelt

The most important rule is to always strap on a seatbelt when you hit the wheel. Section 138 (3) CMVR 177 MVA of the Motor Vehicles Act lays down the specific fine for not fastening a seatbelt.

Avoid distractions

While you are behind the wheel, ensure that your main focus is on driving. Do not get distracted by loud music or by talking on the phone while driving.

Do not cross the speed limits

The goal of setting a speed limit is to ensure the safety of passengers in the vehicle as well as pedestrians. Besides, driving at high speed, even on roads with less traffic, may result in the driver losing control or a sudden brake fail, thereby causing an accident.

•Service your car regularly

Maintaining your car on a regular basis is vital. Repair worn tires, fix your broken headlights, fix your side mirrors, and replace your engine oil as failing to do so may result in accidents.

CHILDRENS DAY

Jawaharlal Nehru was affectionately called *Chacha Nehru* ("Uncle Nehru") by children, and their faith in him was a constant source of happiness for him.^[8] As the Prime Minister, Nehru wanted to "create an atmosphere in the country where the attention is constantly focused on children and their welfare".^[13] He had also established <u>Children's Film Society India</u> in 1955 so that Indian children could see themselves represented.^[14]

Nehru's concern for children and their welfare, <u>M. O. Mathai</u> wrote in his book *My Days With Nehru* (1979), "Nehru saw in their innocent faces and sparkling eyes the future of India. He was convinced that no amount of money spent on children and their mothers was too much, and that it was a sound investment for the future."^[15] When asked by <u>Ram Narayan Chaudhary</u> in an interview in 1958, if he was fond of children because the future of the country depended on the children, Nehru had replied, "I have always felt that the children of today will make the India of tomorrow, and, the way we bring them up will determine the future of the country.

This philosophy is expressed in the letters written by him to <u>Indira</u> <u>Gandhi</u>, his daughter, when she was a young girl. The letters were also published as books. <u>Letters from a Father to His</u> <u>Daughter</u> (1929) and <u>Glimpses of World History</u> (1934) have gained fame as children's non-fiction because, as Deepa Agarwal writes, "any child can respond to their warm, affectionate tone and his lucid and spontaneous style. The wealth of information woven into them and his unique approach to historical facts is an added bonus... communicating humanist values".[[]























INTERNATIONAL DAY OF TOLERANCE

In 1996, the UN General Assembly adopted <u>Resolution 51/95</u> proclaiming 16 November as **International Day for Tolerance**.

This action followed the adoption of a <u>Declaration of Principles on</u> <u>Tolerance</u> by UNESCO's Member States on 16 November 1995. Among other things, the <u>Declaration</u> affirms that tolerance is neither indulgence nor indifference. It is respect and appreciation of the rich variety of our world's cultures, our forms of expression and ways of being human. Tolerance recognizes the universal human rights and fundamental freedoms of others. People are naturally diverse; only tolerance can ensure the survival of mixed communities in every region of the globe.





WORLD DAY OF REMEMBRANCE FOR ROAD TRAFFIC VICTIMS

As every year, the objectives of WDoR 2022 are to provide a platform for road traffic victims and their families to:

remember all people killed and seriously injured on the roads;
acknowledge the crucial work of the emergency services;

•draw attention to the generally trivial legal response to culpable road deaths and injuries and advocate for an appropriately serious response;

•advocate for better support for road traffic victims and victim families;

•promote evidence-based actions to prevent and eventually stop further road traffic deaths and injuries

Every year, millions more road victims are added to the current toll of over 50 million killed and hundreds of millions injured since the first road death 125 years ago last August – a disaster that continues day in and day out in all countries of the world. It is an actual pandemic, affecting primarily our vulnerable and our young, which in addition to the trauma of injury and bereavement has also a devastating economic impact for countries, communities and families. Therefore, during the new Decade of Action 2021-2030 the World Day will have the important role of helping to achieve the 50% road casualty reduction target.

CLASS XI A-CONSTITUTION DAY OF INDIA

Constitution Day (<u>IAST</u>: *Samvidhāna Divasa*), also known as "National Law Day", is celebrated in India on 26 November every year to commemorate the adoption of the Constitution of India. On 26 November 1949, the Constituent Assembly of India adopted to the Constitution of India, and it came into effect on 26 January 1950.[1] The Government of India declared 26 November as Constitution Day on 19 November 2015 by a gazette notification. The Prime Minister of India Narendra Modi made the declaration on 11 October 2015 while laying the foundation stone of the B. R. Ambedkar's Statue of Equality memorial in Mumbai.^[2] The year of 2021 was the 131st birth anniversary of Ambedkar, who had chaired the drafting committee of the Constituent Assembly and played a pivotal role in the drafting of the constitution.^[1] Previously this day was celebrated as Law Day.^[3] 26 November was chosen to spread the importance of the constitution and to spread thoughts and ideas of Ambedkar. PM Modi Speech On National Law Day 2021, 26 November, and also The President, Vice President and Lok Sabha Speaker also addressed the program.
