THEME: IT'S STORY TIME

TERM 1 - FIELD TRIP TOYS DAY OUT - 07.08.2023

Going on a field trip enhances their critical thinking skills and gives students a chance to think about a topic or theme from a different perspective. All the children went to Toys Day Out (Cheeky Monkey in Grand Mall) they played all types of games and played in the play zone area. Children experienced the typical field trip location with their peers. A school trip gives students the chance to experience the venue.



ORGANISED GAMES JUMP OUT OF THE CIRCLE - 09.08.2023

This game helps the children to participate and to develop attention and focus while playing. All children enjoyed jumping in and out of the hula hoops. This improves their concentration and gross motor skills.



ART AND CRAFT - MOBILES Little Red Hen/Jumbo the Elephant 11.08.2023

This activity is based on the theme "It's story time". Boys did "Jumbo the Elephant" as their mobiles and Girls did "The Little Red Hen" as theirs. Children learn to know about the story's characters and it also helps improve their fine motor skills.



INDEPENDENCE DAY CELEBRATION 14.08.2023

77th Independence day celebrated on 15th of August. It is celebrated to educate children about the history and importance of the day. The celebration is a way to instil patriotism, pride, and love for the country in the young minds. It is a day to remember the sacrifices made by the freedom fighters and to pay tribute to them. Children celebrated the event by coming in colour dresses and they enjoyed participating in dance with the help of the teachers they made a tricolour flag as take home activity.



ART AND CRAFT - DRAWING Draw face with patterns - 17.08.2023

Children learn to draw patterns [standing line, sleeping line, c curve]. It helps concentration and hand-eye coordination. They learn what comes next, to make logical connections to draw the eye, nose, and mouth by using patterns.



SPECIAL EVENT STORY CARNIVAL - 21.08.2023

Story carnival is organized for children to encourage their love for reading, storytelling, and imagination. This event provides a platform for children to showcase their storytelling skills and allows them to engage with other children who share the same interests. Additionally, it also helps in improving their public speaking and presentation skills, which will be useful as they grow up. The event aims at reading, storytelling, and imaginative play, and fosters a supportive community of learners. They enjoyed listening to the rhymes and story(Jumbo the Elephant) as imitated with the puppet in puppet theatre. This improves listening skills, concentration, and fine motor skills through playing with puppets. They did take-home activities as "Red Hen".



PERSONALITY DEVELOPMENT IMPORTANCE OF HEALTHY EATING 22.08.2023

In personality development, the children learned about the importance of healthy eating (fruits, vegetables, grains, dairy, meats etc.) Through this children understand which is healthy food and unhealthy food, which gives vitamins, minerals, calcium, carbohydrates, etc. Children learned about the importance of eating healthy food.



SKILL DEVELOPMENT PICKING THE COLOUR BALLS - 23.08.2023

Children enjoyed this game by playing with their friends by picking coloured balls from respective coloured boxes and sorting them based on the colours. Children learned to identify the colours and played with balls. It builds hand-eye coordination and gross and fine motor skills.



GROUP ACTIVITY STORY SEQUENCE – 24.08.2023

Group activities help children to coordinate and work with their peer group. It is also a better way to learn from each other. In a group activity, children stuck glitter sheets and crepe paper on the sequence of all the characters based on the story "Jumbo the Elephant ".This activity helped children to understand about story sequence as well as the characters of the story.

In addition, rainwater can seep through landfill sites and leach out pollutants from the landfills' trash. So, it's important to teach children at a young age the proper ways of disposing of household waste. Children were taught how poor disposal of waste can affect our environment and the importance of having two dustbins in a home to put dry and wet wastes separately and use wet wastes from the kitchen as compost for plants.

Island jumping activity was also done to make them identify the Islands around India. When the Island name was said the child should jump into the circle named after that particular Island. This develops the gross motor skill of the children.















SPECIAL EVENT VOYAGERS DAY - 23.08.2023

Based on the theme Wonders of the World, each child was given a topic based on the seven Wonders of the World. The children happily participated in the event. The children holding their pluck cards explained their given topic. Three countries' traditional food was also presented. The children participated in the quiz time, open questions were asked about our country and our symbols, neighboring countries, and their symbols, and about the seven wonders.









NO PLASTIC PROJECT SINGLE USE PLASTIC - 24.08.23

INDEPENDENCE DAY CELEBRATION AT SAN ACADEMY KAMAKOTI NAGAR (15.08.23)

Every year the campus of San Academy Kamakoti Nagar brightens up with pride on Independence Day. This year was no different as the patriotic flavour could be seen all around in orange, green, white and blue. The theme being "Nation first. Always First" all the programmes were related to the same in one form or the other. The main celebration was done in their auditorium. The day marked a successful celebration of independence with a rainbow of cultural programs prepared under the able stewardship of the teachers for this auspicious occasion and due homage and honour expressed towards the people who played their part in the independence of the country. The hidden talent of our young citizens was on display with their wonderful insights and colourful thoughts.

The day began with the march past by the band, followed by cubs, bulbuls, scouts and guides. The students and the teachers were not far behind. The traditional auspicious Flag hoisting ceremony as a tribute to our Motherland was accompanied not only by the National Anthem but also the flag songs in Hindi and Tamil. Speeches in Tamil, Hindi and English enlightened the audience as to what independence actually was, explained the theme of the year and the need to appreciate the freedom we have. But that was not all. There was also a moving speech on 'The Unsung heroes of the Freedom Struggle'. These speeches illuminated the audience about India's phenomenal history, legends, culture and values and also why we are celebrating our Independence Day. Patriotic songs were sung with great feeling by the students in Hindi and Tamil. This parody of songs awakened everyone's feelings towards our motherland, and kept the audience humming to songs like Vande Mataram and Semmozhiyam Tamil mozhiyam even after the programme ended. Well-known and little-known freedom fighters took to centre stage, in the form of a fashion show and role play, when students dressed up as the leaders and spoke about their contribution to the independence movement. On show were Bharathiyar, Pandit Nehru, Subhash Chandra Bose, Jhansi Ki Rani, Bhagat Singh, Velu Nachiar, Kittur Chennamma, Sarojini Naidu among others. The life of Thiruppur Kumaran was presented as a skit by the students of Senior KG children. These programmes were a reminder to everyone present, of the struggles our nation's founders went through to let us live such a free and independent life.

The mime presented by the students of class 7 was intense and mind blowing. The audience was a witness to the Champaran Satyagraha which was a peasant uprising, led by Mahatma Gandhi in the Champaran district of Bihar. The students could bring out the feelings that evoked in the farmers in the region who revolted against the British power against the imposed indigo cultivation between 1914 and 1916 instead of the food crops which were necessary for their survival. The protest was beautifully portrayed. Keeping in mind the upcoming eighteenth meeting of Group of Twenty - The 2023 G20 New Delhi summit, the first ever G20 summit to be held in India as well as in South Asia, students from Classes 9 and 10 created a platform for G20 Panel discussion, sharing their opinions on various topics. The panelists elucidated the important role in shaping and strengthening global architecture and provided a deep insight into their chosen topics.

The Principal Mrs. Ganga Natarajan, emphasised upon the fact that one should not understand oneself free of responsibilities towards India but we have to use it to shape our future. Our country is a nation that boasts of diverse cultures and traditions, people from different cultural backgrounds and ethnic milieus. So she asked one and all to be proud of our country and not bring it down in front of a foreigner.

To enhance the understanding of concepts of EVS, we include various fixtures like quiz, riddles, discussion, songs, role play, etc., into our culminating activity which help in the holistic development of the individual kids. We maintain that school is a place which provides quality education to the children and also furnish an opportunity to learn new things in many ways, which in turn helps them nurture their interests. We recognize that each student prefers different learning style, techniques and approaches. Some are visual learners, whereas some learn effectively through listening and following instructions, some through experiments, games and so on.

Everyone has a mix of learning styles.We have not only adopted different ways of imparting knowledge but also provide the platform and opportunity to the children to synthesize the knowledge and strengthen experience gained throughout their learning process by displaying their understanding of the subject. 5 E's Engage, Explore, Explain, Elaborate (Expand), and Evaluate were utilized in their presentation making the EVS culmination activity a very captivating one. The activity was held for classes 1 and 2 on August 21 and 22

. The students demonstrated their depth of knowledge accumulated across the first term. The little ones decided to create an impact on the audience by adhering to the practice of showing something and describing it to them. They brought real objects, models, plants, charts and soft toys and explained about topics like traffic lights and different parts of plants. Children dressed up as various characters and gave some interesting facts about themselves. Enterprising ventures kept following one after the other. A colourful dance was performed to explain about the rainbow; Saving our environment is a major concern these days and thus we had a mime show that propagated the theme of 'Saving Trees'; How are trees helpful to us? Well the young learners walked the ramp for the fashion walk based on tree products. Concepts taught with the help of story, songs, actions always leave a lasting impression on the innocent minds. So the concept of herbivores, carnivores and omnivores were explained in the form of musical skit. Riddles fascinate children and they like to show their upmanship with their knowledge on any topic. 

International Lefthanders Day was created to celebrate sinistrality and <u>raise awareness</u> of the advantages and <u>disadvantages</u> of being left-handed in a predominantly <u>right-handed</u> world. It celebrates left-handed people's uniqueness and differences, a subset of humanity comprising <u>seven to ten percent</u> of the world's population.^[3] The day also spreads awareness on issues faced by <u>left-handers</u>, e.g. the importance of the special needs for left-handed children, and the likelihood for left-handers to develop <u>schizophrenia</u>.








WORLD ELEPHANT DAY



MADRAS DAY


Madras Day is a festival organised to commemorate the founding of the city of <u>Madras</u> in Tamil Nadu, India. It is celebrated on 22 August every year, 22 August 1639 being the widely agreed date for the purchase of the village of Madraspatnam or Chennapatnam by <u>East India</u> <u>Company</u> factors <u>Andrew Cogan</u> and <u>Francis Day</u> from Damarla Venkatadri Nayaka, the viceroy of the <u>Vijayanagar Empire</u>.

The idea of a Madras Day was first suggested by Chennaibased journalists <u>Vincent D'Souza</u>, editor, <u>Mylapore Times</u> (a local newspaper) and Sashi Nair, director and editor, <u>Press</u> <u>Institute of India</u>, to historian <u>S. Muthiah</u> during a conversation at Muthiah's home in 2004. Since then, Madras Day celebrations have been held every year without fail, its highlights being exhibitions, lectures, film screenings and quizzes. The Madras Day festival has registered a steady increase in popularity year after year. Between 2014 and 2019, the editions lasted through August and extended into September as well, with more than 120-odd programmes, prompting demands to rename Madras Day as Madras Week, or even Madras Month.^[1]


Why National Handloom Day is celebrated?

After the British failed to secure Indian support for the British war effort with <u>Cripps Mission</u>, Gandhi made a call to *Do or Die* in his <u>Quit India speech</u> delivered in Bombay on 9 August 1942 at the <u>Gowalia Tank Maidan</u>. Viceroy <u>Linlithgow</u> remarked the movement to be "by far the most serious rebellion since 1857

WORLD YOUTH DAY

World Youth Day (WYD) is an event for young people organized by the <u>Catholic Church</u> that was initiated by <u>Pope</u> <u>John Paul II</u> in 1985. Its concept has been influenced by the <u>Light-Life</u> Movement that has existed in Poland since the 1960s, where during summer camps Catholic young adults over 13 days of camp celebrated a "day of community". For the first celebration of WYD in 1986, bishops were invited to schedule an annual youth event to be held every <u>Palm</u> <u>Sunday</u> in their dioceses. Nicknamed "The Catholic Woodstock", it is celebrated at the <u>diocesan</u> level annually—in most places on Palm Sunday from 1986 to 2020, and from 2021 on <u>Christ the King Sunday</u>—and at the international level every two to three years at different locations.
