
Jr.Kg kids went field trip based their theme veggie view, they visit to Adayar Ananda Bhavan veggie market during school hours.

Organic farming, also known as ecological farming or biological farming, is an agricultural system that uses fertilizers of organic origin such as compost manure, green manure, and bone meal. It emphasis on techniques such as crop rotation and companion planting. Today Mr. Shankar gave a brief explanation on the cultivation of vegetables like radish, cabbage, lady's finger, cauliflower, yam and brinjal using organic fertilizers. ELECTRICAL TECHNOLOGY

As a follow up of last month's session few students brought series and parallel circuits built of their own kindling interest in other students.




ART EDUCATION

Highlights of the event:








DEXTERITY PHASE, VEXILLOLOGY AND VISIONARY CORNER


