5.9.2023

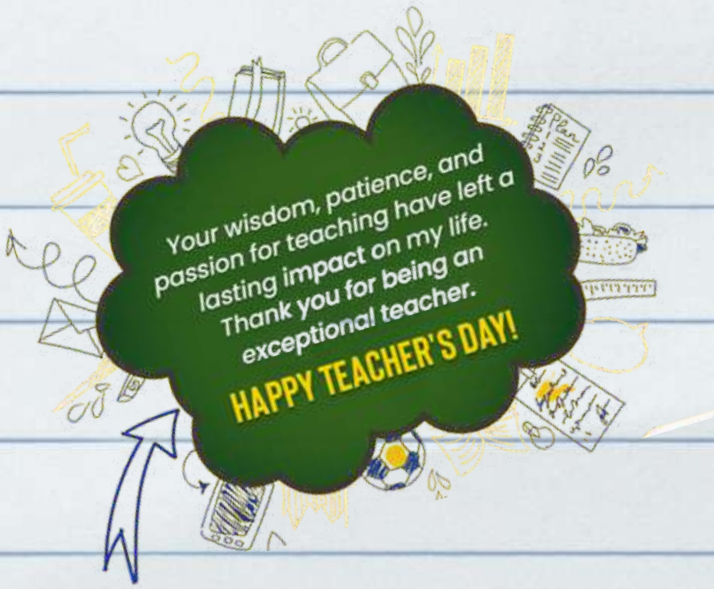

The session ended with a vote of thanks and a group photo. Overall, it was an informative interaction and an excellent session.

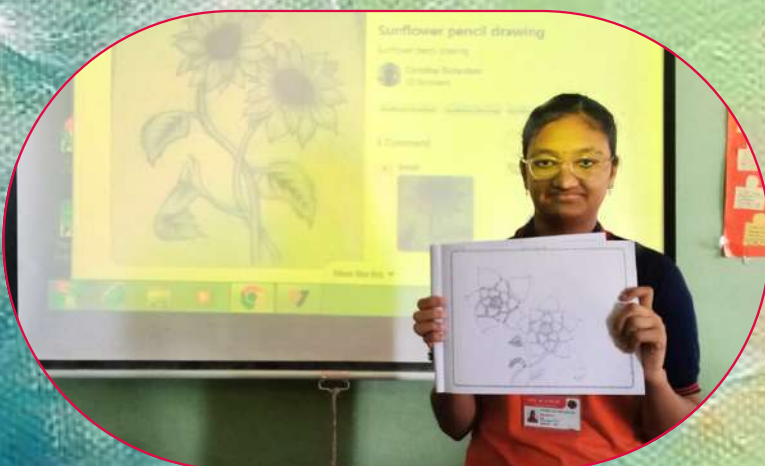
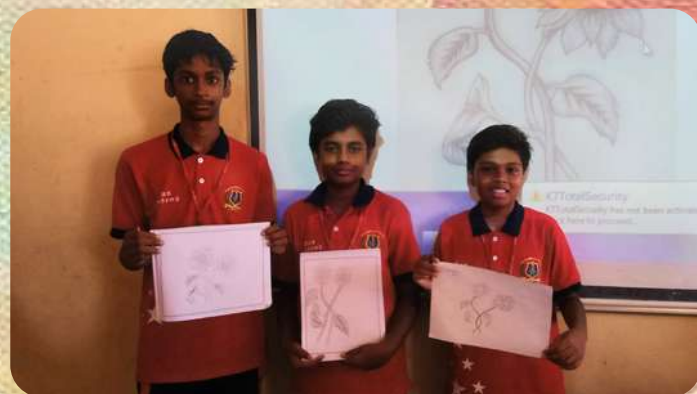


ART EDUCATION

RIFLEMAN

Rifleman Sanjay Kumar was born in village Kasal Bahain in Bilaspur District of Himachal Pradesh. On 4 July 1999, as a member of the 19th Battalion, Jammu and Kashmir Rifles, he was the leading scout of a team tasked to capturing the Blat Top during the Kargil War. The area was held by Pakistan troops. Realising the magnitude of the problem, he crawled alone up the ridge and charged towards the enemy bunker through a hail of automatic fire. Instantly he took two bullets in his chest and forenoon that left him bleeding. Though bleeding profusely he refused to be evacuated. In ensuing hand-to-hand combat, he killed three enemy soldiers. He then picked an enemy machine gun and craft towards the second enemy bunker. Inspired by his brave action, the rest of the platoon charged, assaulted the position and captured the Blat Top. He displayed most conspicuous gallantry, cool courage and devotion to duty of an exceptionally high order in the face of the enemy. He was awarded the **PARAM VIR CHAKRA**, India's highest military decoration. He stands as a role-model for each one of us.
