REPUBLIC DAY CELEBRATION

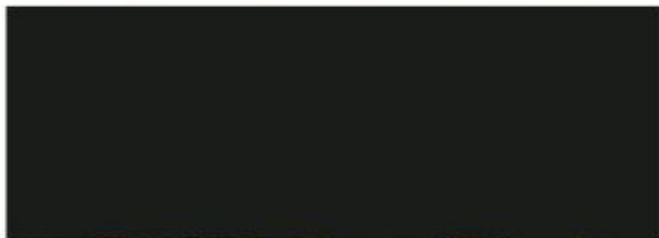

Pongal Celebration

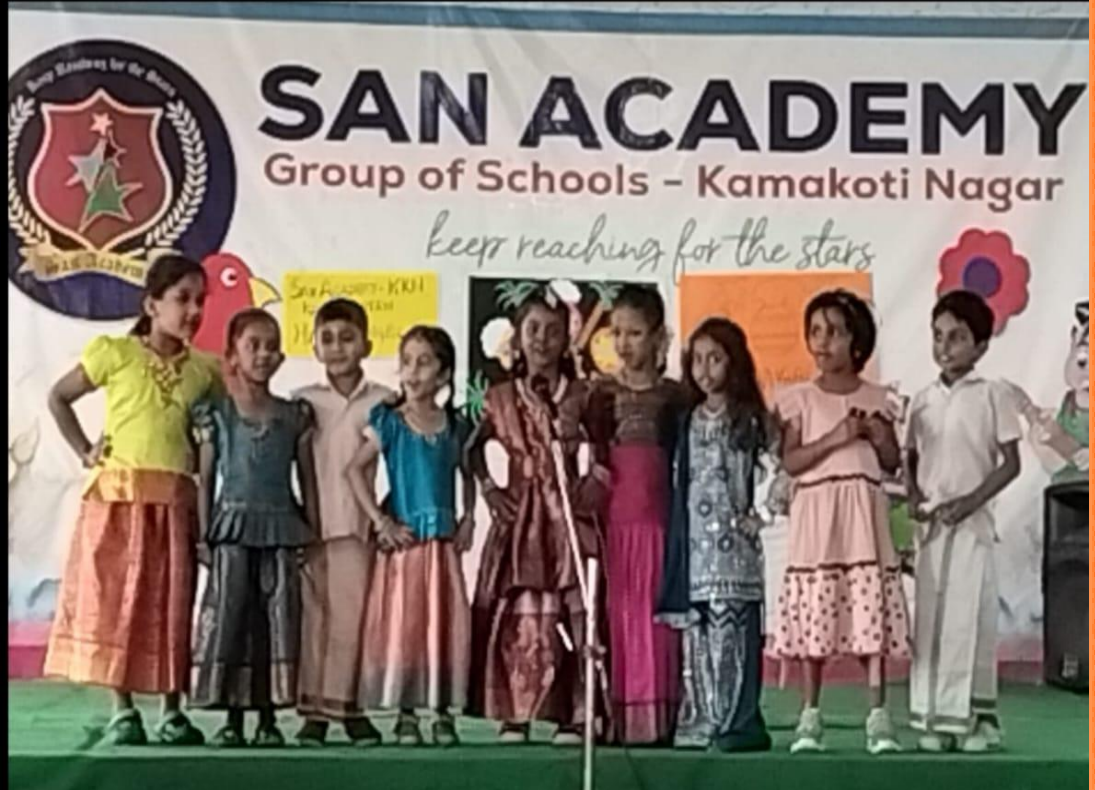

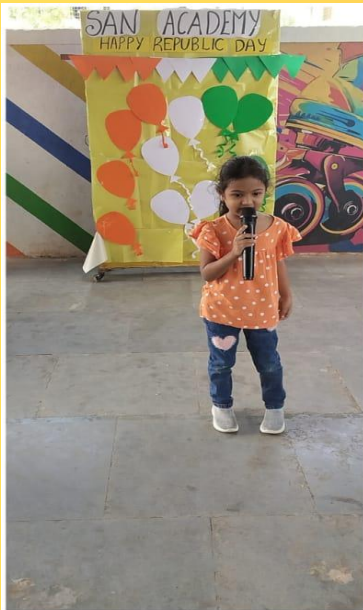


Republic day Celebration

Kitchen Gardening

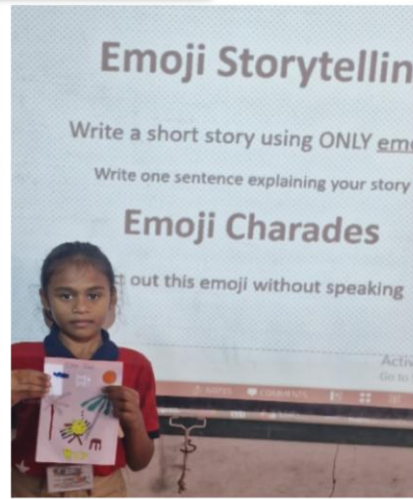
