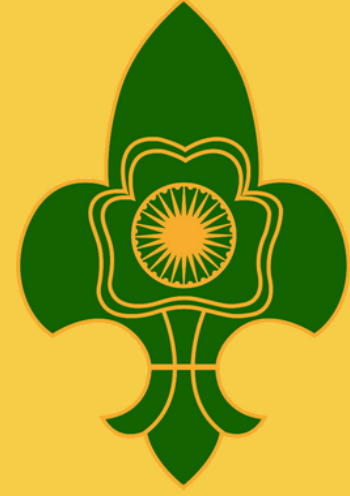


INVESTITURE CEREMONY 2025-26

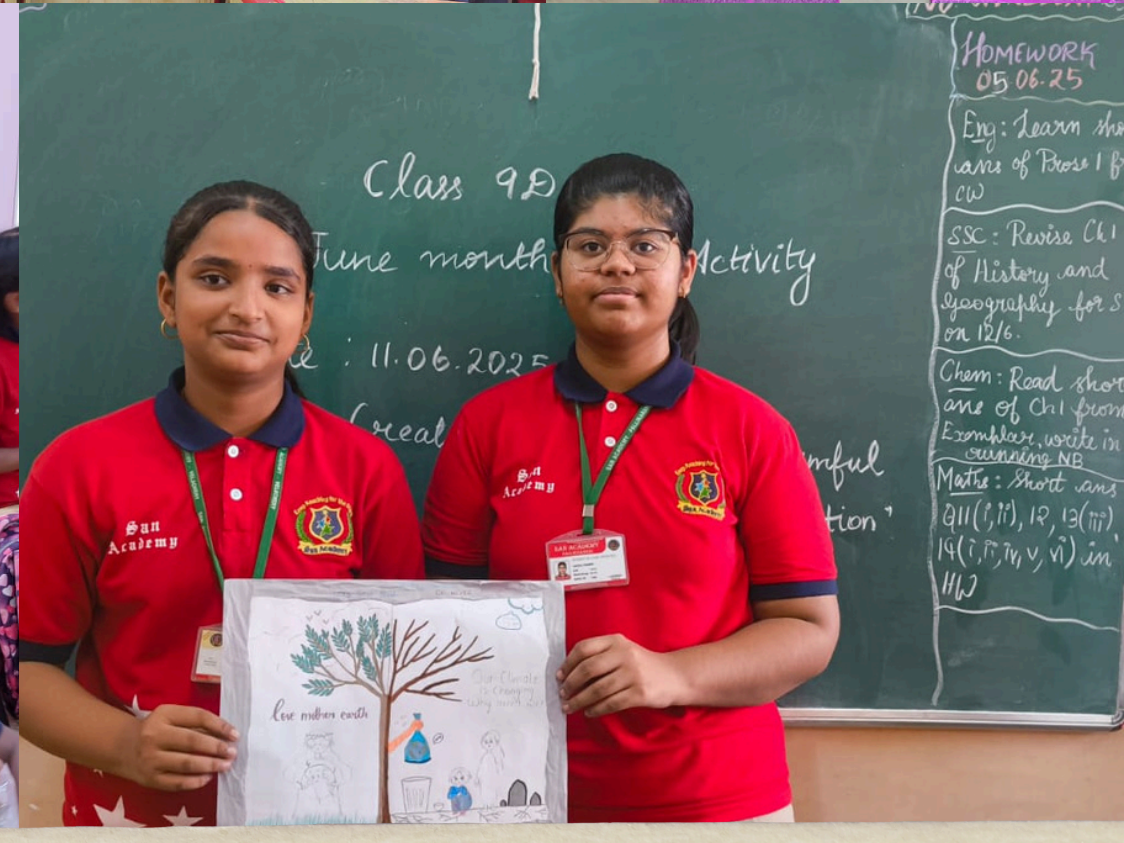
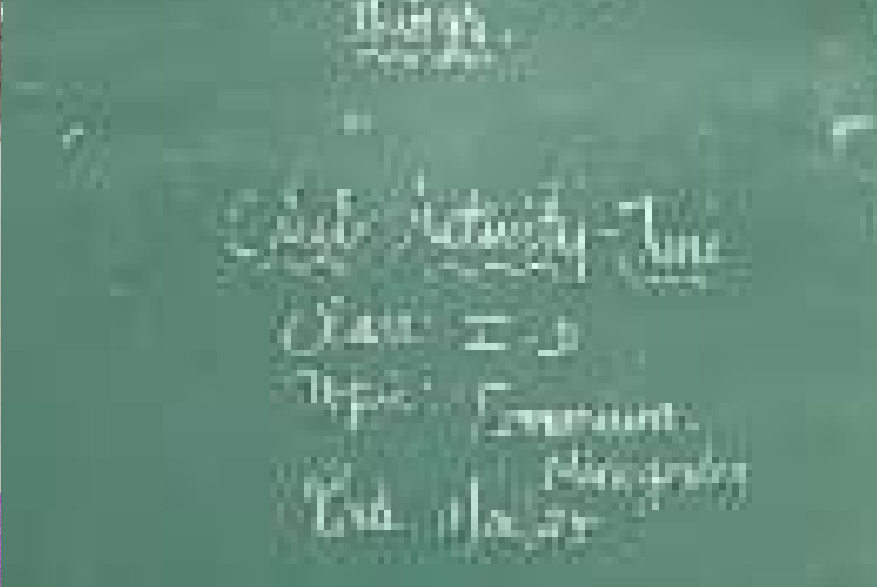
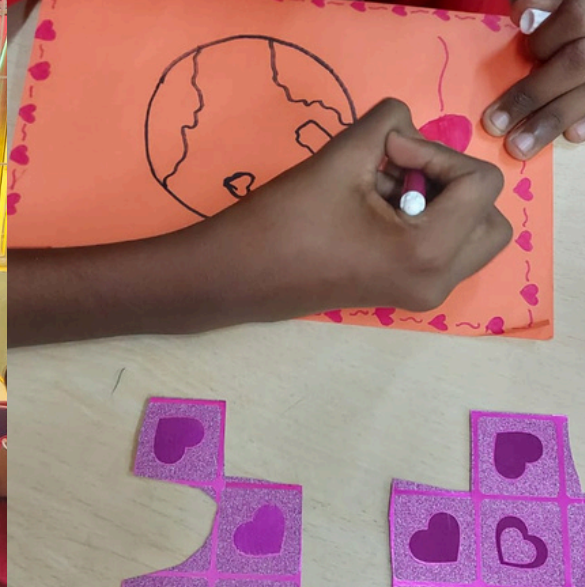


NO BAG DAY

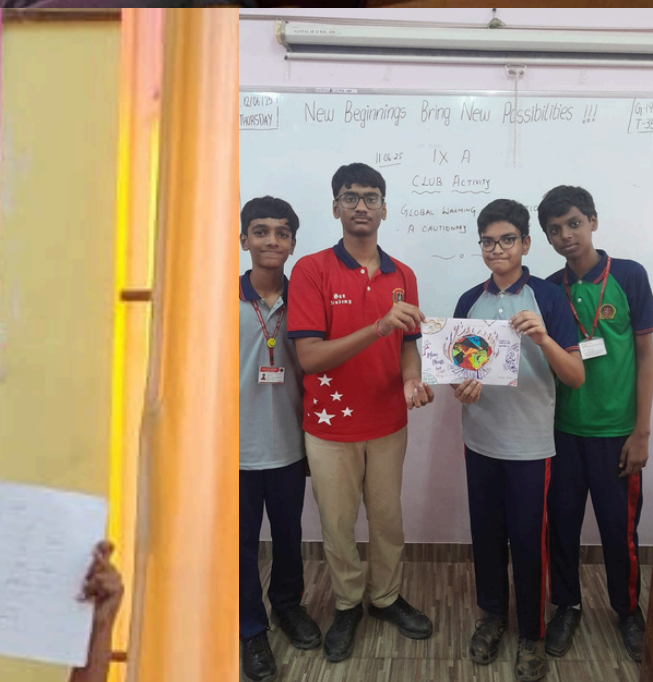

COMMITTEE MEETING

The POCSO Committee meeting was held on 21st June from 11:30 AM to 12:30 PM, with 12 members in attendance. Key discussions included the CBSE circular on using positive affirmations to create a supportive environment. Ideas were shared to integrate these into assemblies and classroom routines. The committee also proposed creating cyber safety charts to promote safe online behavior. Attendance concerns were noted, and alternate meeting days were suggested. Topics like self-confidence, empathy, and communication skills were proposed for upcoming personality development classes. Infrastructure issues, such as the sewage system and service road, were raised and will be reported to concerned authorities.

ORIENTATION FOR CLASSES 3–5 TEACHERS

An orientation session was conducted on 21st June from 9:15 to 9:45 AM for teachers of Classes 3 to 5. It covered key aspects of the POCSO Act, including identifying signs of abuse, dispelling myths, and creating a safe space for students. The session introduced the Three-Tier Model for addressing behavioral challenges:

- Tier 1 (Universal): Positive discipline, supervision, and awareness programs.
- Tier 2 (Targeted): Small group interventions, peer buddies, and parental involvement.
- Tier 3 (Individualized): Support from counselors, special educators, and expert referrals.
- Teachers were encouraged to apply these strategies to build a safe, supportive classroom environment.

ORIENTATION FOR SUPPORT STAFF
