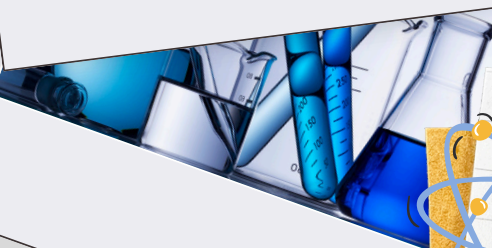

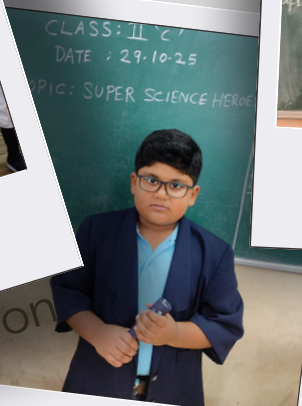

# PTA MEETING

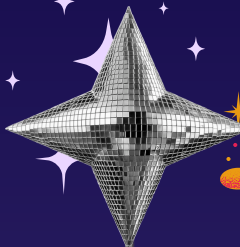
